This volume collects the proceedings of the seminar held on November 25, 2021 and is part of the Research Project of National Interest, initiated by the Universities of Florence, Rome, Macerata and Pisa, aiming at addressing issues concerning “*The impact of technologies on self- and co-regulation processes: towards a technological rule of law*” (PRIN SECORETECH 2017).

In particular, the volume provides a framework of the numerous opinions adopted by the Scientific and Technical Committee, established in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic crisis, in support of the regulatory decisions made by the government, which have significantly affected a number of constitutionally protected rights.

More generally, this work constitutes an opportunity to reflect on the relationship between politics and technique, aiming at raising the positive aspects, to be saved, and the negative ones, to be set aside, of the recent experience of dialogue between institutional actors (Government and Parliament) and technical bodies. In fact, it is precisely the impact of the scientific data on the protection of rights, as determined by the Scientific and Technical Committee by analyzing the regulatory production during the emergency phase, that constitutes the thread linking the various contributions contained in this original research.
